HOW DOES IT WORK?

You are responsible for transporting your materials to the Ecocenter. Once on site, an employee will greet you and explain the procedure. All you have to do is sort your items yourself and place them in the appropriate containers.

ACCESS TO THE SITE AND SPECIFICATIONS

To be eligible for the service, you must meet the following specifications:



Be a resident of Ayer's Cliff or Hatley (proof of residence **required**)



Access the site with a passenger vehicle (car, SUV, pickup truck) with or without a trailer.



Transport waste that is exclusively from domestic and non-profit sources.

Your access to the site will be denied if:



You do not provide proof of residence



The materials come from commerce or industry;



You wish to access the site with a vehicle other than a passenger vehicule.

RULES

Customers must sort, deposit, and unload their materials themselves at the appropriate locations.

The municipality reserves the right to impose limits on residents in special cases.

It is strictly prohibited to leave materials on site outside of opening hours.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS



Hazardous household waste (HHW) -

Limited to the following:

- Containers and aerosols for paint and dye (except automotive and industrial) and varnish
- Brake, engine, and transmission oils
- Vegetable oils
- Prestone-type antifreeze
- Brake cleaners and lubricants in aerosols
- Oil filters for engines and heating systems

Electronic devices

- Audio systems, players, consoles
- Keyboards, mice, monitors, computers
- Cell phones, cameras
- Televisions, speakers

Recyclable materials

- Glass
- Paper and cardboard
- Plastic and cans

Textiles

- Clothing
- Fabrics / Material
- Shoes
- Clothing accessories

Green waste

- Dead leaves, grass, and turf (to be placed in a container by you)
- Small branches (less than 4 inches in diameter)

Metal

- Scarp metal
- Iron, copper, aluminum, stainless steel
- Mechanical parts
- Appliances (except thermopumps)

Other

- Tires off the rims
- Propane tanks

WHAT IS AN ECO-CENTER FOR?

This service significantly reduces the volume of waste sent to landfill, increases the potential for recovering recyclable or recoverable materials, and promotes the reuse of a wide variety of items.

NEW: REUSE SECTION Choose to reuse!



Do you have furniture or electronics in good condition that you no longer use? Rather than throwing them away, bring them to our reuse section at the eco-center!

Reusable items are collected and made available to citizens free of charge, with the aim of encouraging reuse.

DISTRIBUTION OF COMPOST AND WOOD CHIPS

Compost and wood chips are available for residents to collect free of charge, while supplies last.

The compost is provided by the Régie des déchets (waste management authority) and comes from your compost bins. The more you compost, the more compost the municipality will collect the following year.

Wood chips are delivered regularly after tree shredding operations.
